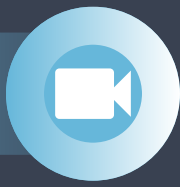

## Panel speakers



### Ed Lamb

Ed Lamb is a Green party councillor on Wirral Council. Wirral council **has an ambitious programme of transport initiatives to enable more sustainable travel** including building further segregated walking, cycling and wheeling routes and further rollout of 20mph areas across the borough.



### Agustina Martire

Agustina is an urbanist and activist who teaches architecture at Queens University Belfast, and **specialises in the study of everyday streets, their fabric, histories, and experiences through the StreetSpace project**. Agustina will be talking about Open Botanic: A hopeful approach to inclusive streets.



### Peter McColl

Peter McColl is a leading Scottish public affairs, engagement and policy professional. Peter will focus on the **concept of 'loser's consent'**- how we can ensure the **outcome of engagement is one people can live with** and the use of **various information sources to supplement consultations**.
